Established in 1859, Mt. St. Mary Academy is the oldest continuously operating Catholic school west of the Mississippi River. An educational ministry of the Catholic Church, we are proud to serve families from the Parishes of St. Patrick, St. Canice and St. Dominic, as well as those in the surrounding communities. Recognizing that parents are the primary educators of children, we collaborate with them to help our students achieve their fullest potentials in the areas of faith development, academic excellence, social awareness and emotional growth. Our school exists to inspire and motivate students to recognize their call to be responsible, faith-filled leaders in today's multi-cultural and diverse world.



Faith Formation

The domains of social, spiritual, physical and academic development are rooted in faith formation. Integrated throughout our school culture and curriculum are opportunities for students to deepen their relationships with Christ and relate Gospel teachings to their personal, everyday experiences. Each morning, school administrators and students assemble for prayer and daily announcements. We also worship together as a campus community at weekly Mass, every Friday. Students participate in every aspect of the celebration; as lectors, altar servers and choir members. In religion class, children learn about our Catholic heritage and culture, and prepare to receive the Sacraments of First Communion, the Rite of Reconciliation, and Confirmation. Inspired by faith to show compassion and empathy to others, Mt. St. Mary Academy supports charitable causes like Food for the Poor (sponsoring housing projects in Haiti) during Lent, the Baby Bottle Project and donates canned food and clothing to benefit our local communities. In addition, our middle school students are expected to contribute their time and talents to local communities through direct service. Children who perform God's corporal works of mercy strengthen their faith and learn to honor all members of His kingdom.



Academics and Enrichment

Mt. St. Mary Academy believes that we are all called to offer the best of ourselves to the Lord and to our communities. One of the many ways we can become the best possible versions of our selves is striving for knowledge about each other and about our world. 








Financial information for the 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18 school years is presented above. Note the significant difference between the *Cost to Educate per Student* and the *First Child Parishioner Tuition Rate*. The disparity between these figures is striking for the 2017-18 school year where the deficit is estimated to be \$1,358 per student.



When comparing the *Estimated Deficit per Student* to *K-8 Enrollment* for each period, the data depicts a high correlation between student enrollment, estimated deficit values per student and fundraising needs. These correlational relationships illustrate that strong enrollment numbers are necessary to mitigate the gaps between student tuition and education costs.

Community Involvement and Fundraising

Because Mt. St. Mary Academy tuition is less than the cost to educate, we count on your continued fundraising support to provide the best learning experience for our children.
