Mission

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Catholic School is an educational ministry that serves the faith communities of St. Joseph, St. Maria Goretti, and Good Shepherd Parishes of Elk Grove. The school addresses the needs of all learners in preschool, elementary, and middle school.



St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Catholic School strives to develop the whole child and exists to support parents, the primary educators of their children, in their efforts to build a spiritual and academic community and pass on the values, traditions, and teachings of the Roman Catholic Church.

Faith Formation

Every day, we have the opportunity to exercise free will and live out the moral truths rooted in the Gospels. At St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, we realize that the academic, physical, social and spiritual development of a child is rooted in faith formation. This process begins early in a child's life under the supervision of parents, and is nurtured by the school. Worship is critical to spiritual fulfillment and is a key part of our Catholic Identity as a school community. St. Elizabeth's offers a diocesan standards-based religious education program, and participation in liturgical celebrations at all grade levels. Each morning, all children and staff members gather for morning prayer and special announcements. Students plan and participate in weekly, schoolwide Mass as lectors, altar servers, gift bearers, choral singers, and as a community of witnesses to God's love for us. Middle school students are expected to contribute their time, talents, and service to the local community. Through Christian service, children perform God's corporal works of mercy and learn to appreciate every member of God's kingdom.



Academics and Achievement

Inspired by the example of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, we are an academic community of faith that strives to form the hearts, minds, bodies, and souls of our students in the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the living tradition of the Catholic Church. The intellectual, spiritual, and personal growth of our students is the foundation on which our elementary and middle school academic programs are formed. Aligned with diocesan and state standards, our academics encourage children to question, think critically, and apply their knowledge creatively, nurturing a love for lifelong learning. As educators, we believe it is important to remind children that they have the power to shape their futures through dedication and hard work. All middle school students choose from a variety of electives which include leadership, yearbook, art, choir, instrumental music, STEM, speech and debate, Latin, and applied Church history.


We understand that the learning process does not begin and end in the classroom. Children require opportunities for interaction, education and play, outside of structured environments. They are happiest and perform best when they are free to express their talents and engage socially with their peers. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton offers opportunities for enrichment in basketball, volleyball, track and field, golf, choir, baton, band, and participate in Academic Decathlon, Mental Math Bowl, Religion Decathlon, the Diocesan Speech Contest, and the Spelling Bee. Student Performance Review (1) (2)

*The following graphs compare the student test scores of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton School to those of its neighboring public schools. Students at St. Elizabeth are given STAR Math and STAR Reading Assessments from Renaissance Learning, whereas California public school students are required to take the Smarter Balanced exam under the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) system. The comparison of these separate tests is made possible by the application of psychometric equivalencies, which standardize the criteria used to evaluate and score these different academic assessments. The tables below display grade-level learning data based on both Renaissance STAR and CAASPP student testing results.





Financial information for the 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18 school years is presented above. Note the significant difference between the Cost to Educate per Student and the First Child Parishioner Tuition Rate. The disparity between these figures is striking for the 2017-18 school year where the deficit is estimated to be \$750 per student.

When comparing the **Estimated Deficit per Student** to **K-8 Enrollment** for each period, the data depicts a high correlation between student enrollment, estimated deficit values per student and fundraising needs. These correlational relationships illustrate that **strong enrollment numbers are necessary to mitigate** the gaps between student tuition and education costs.

Community Involvement and Fundraising

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton tuition is less than the cost to educate, so we count on your continued fundraising support to provide the best learning experience for our children.
