- recognize the meaningful impact of civic engagement within in their own community and beyond.





CULTURE OF CARE







Financial information for the 2015-16, 2016-17 and 2017-18 school years is presented above. Note the significant difference between the *Cost to Educate per Student* and the *First Child Parishioner Tuition Rate*. The disparity between these figures is striking for the 2017-18 school year where the deficit is estimated to be \$222 per student.

When comparing the *Estimated Deficit per Student* to *K-8 Enrollment* for each period, the data depicts a high correlation between student enrollment, estimated deficit values per student and fundraising needs. These correlational relationships illustrate that strong enrollment numbers are necessary to mitigate the gaps between student tuition and education costs.

Community Involvement and Fundraising

Because St. Rose School tuition is less than the cost to educate, we count on your continued support to provide the best learning experience for our children. Our most popular events are our Great Gathering Harvest Festival and two Crab Feed and Raffle Events. We look forward to these occasions every year, as they are wonderful opportunities for the community to fundraise while celebrating fellowship and supporting the mission of St. Rose to educate minds and inspire spirits. Proceeds from these, and all other fundraising opportunities, help pay for expenses that tuition does not cover.

It is also expected that families will be involved on a voluntary basis to provide services that benefit the school. Family participation in our Scrip and volunteer programs is invaluable because it helps us lower operating costs and enhance the educational experience for our children. St. Rose extends families the option of need-based financial aid. On average, our families receive approximately \$60,000 in tuition assistance each year. We appreciate and honor the sacrifices of our families who believe in the value of a Catholic School experience, and trust St. Rose as their partner in education. Your ongoing support demonstrates a strong sense of community; and that is what separates St. Rose School from other educational environments.
