Throughout the year, all students are expected to contribute their time and service to charitable causes. By performing God's corporal works of mercy, they gain a deeper understanding of the human community and a greater respect for every member of God's kingdom on Earth.

- Embrace new concepts and ideas, listen to others and to use creativity as a tool for problem solving.

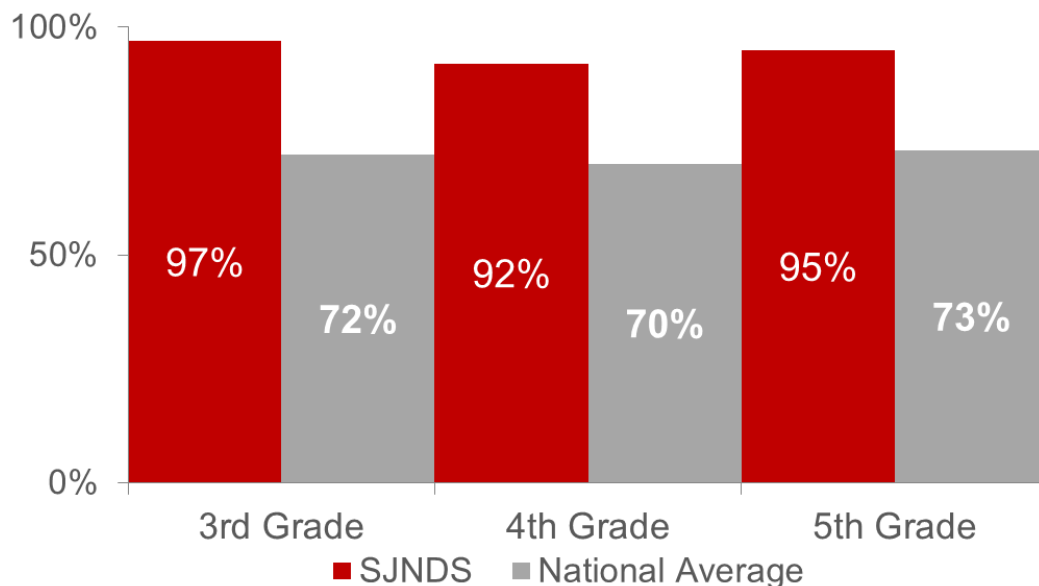

## Student Performance Review (1)

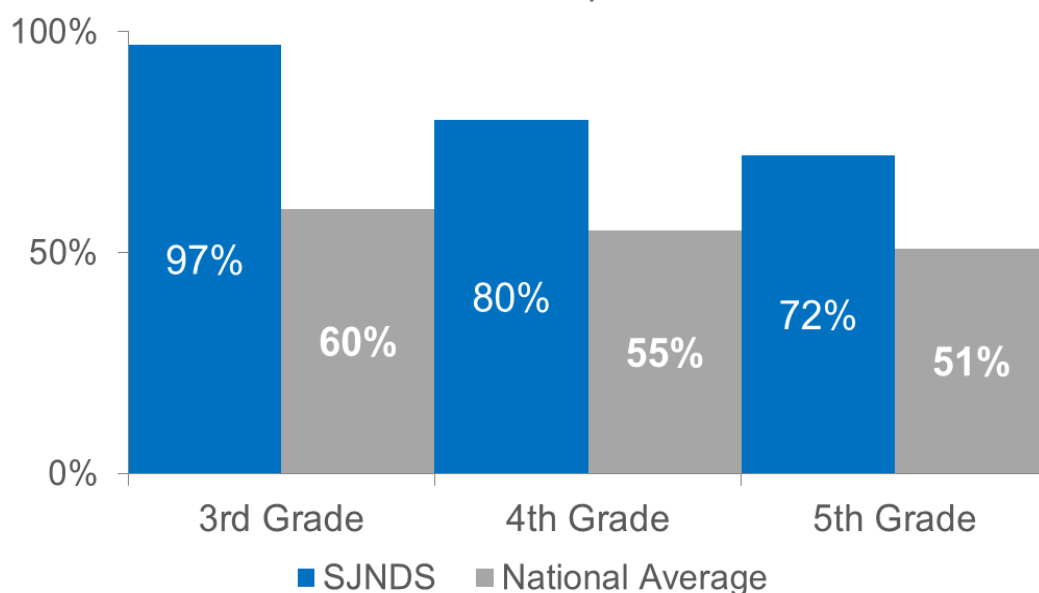
Average Proficiency Scores of Elementary School Students on ACT Aspire English, 2017

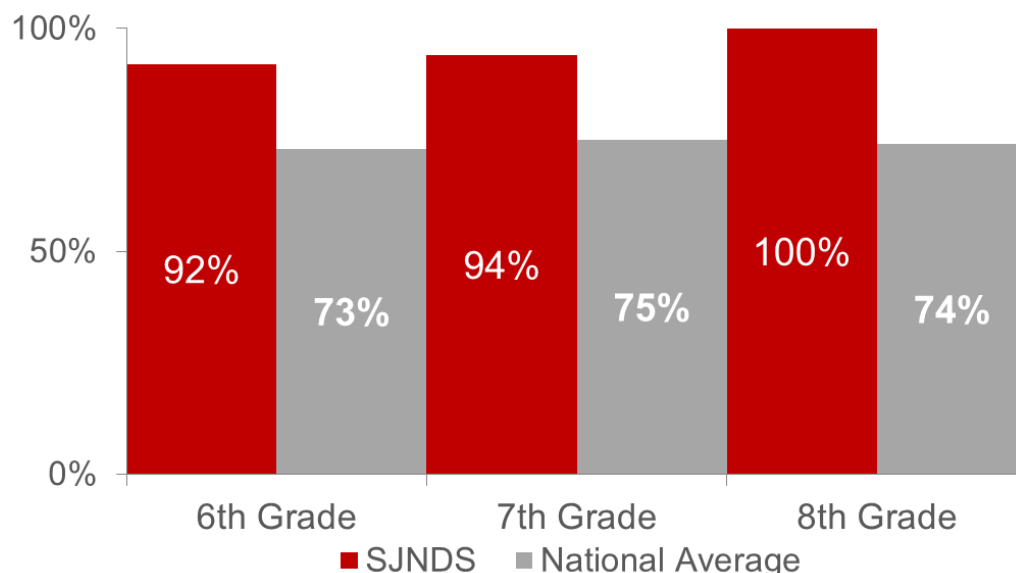

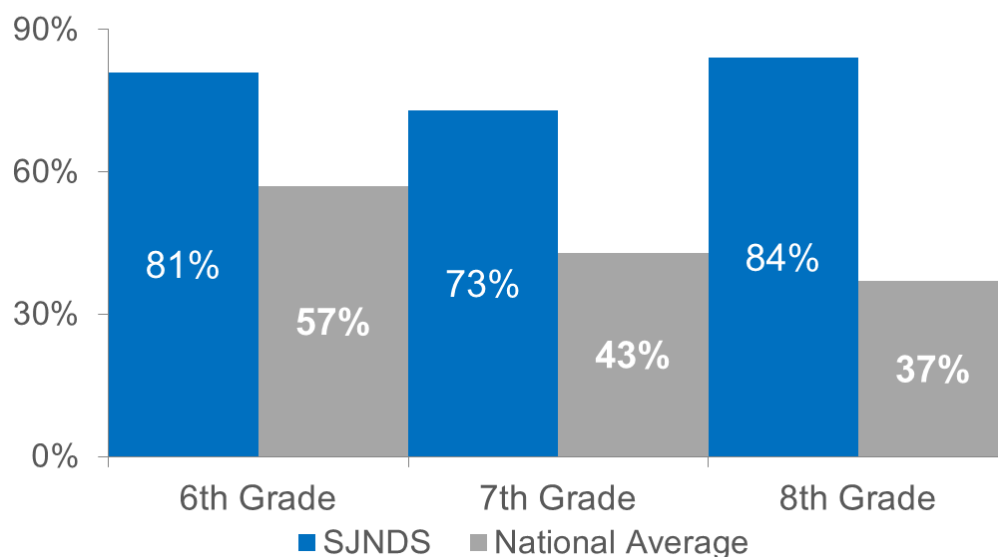
Average Proficiency Scores of Middle School Students on ACT Aspire English, 2017

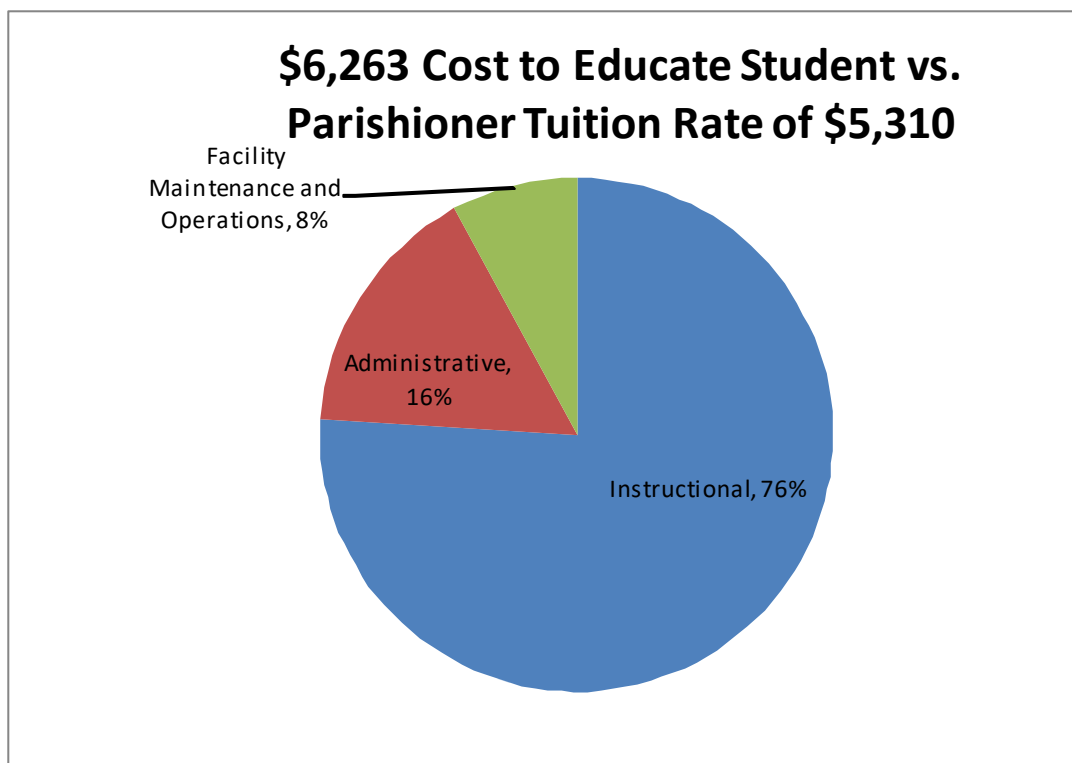

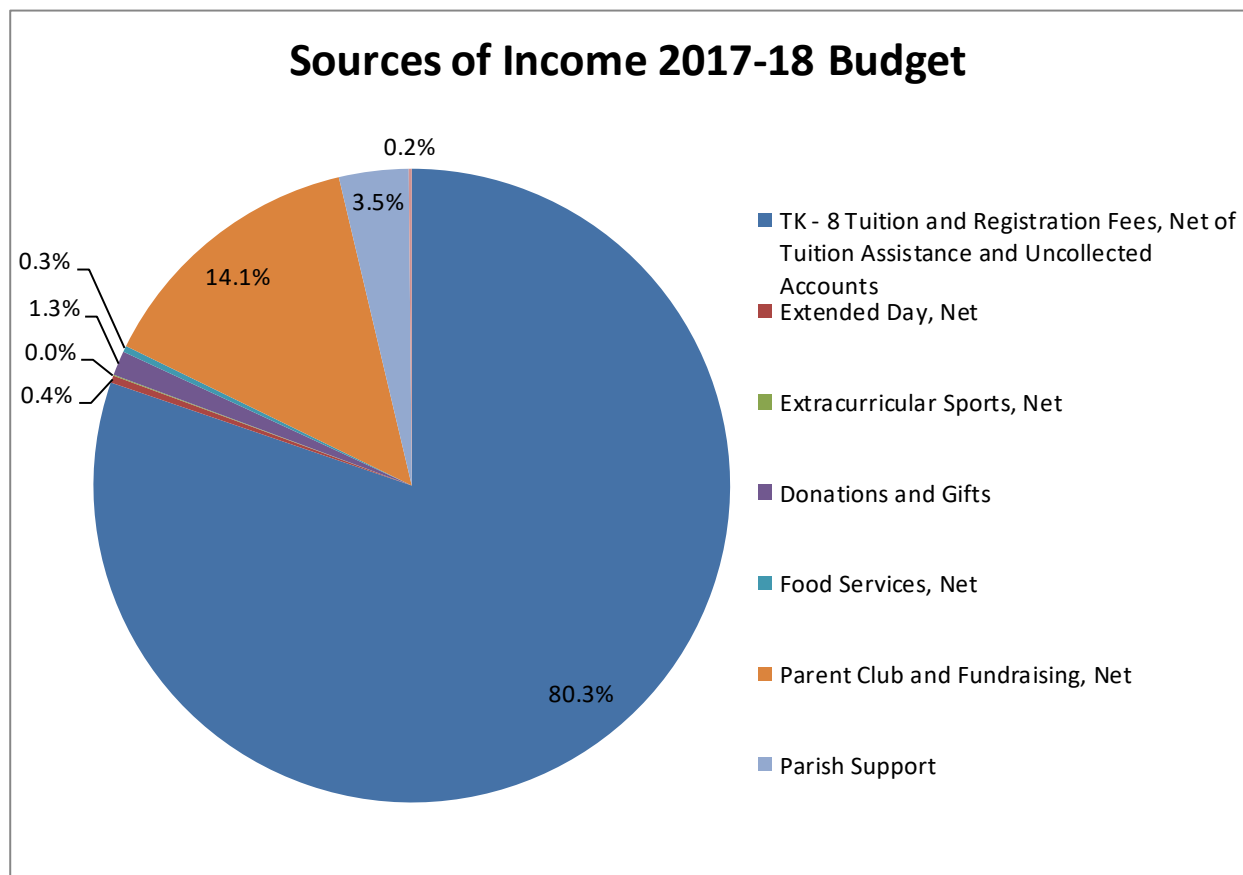
Note the significant difference between the **Cost to Educate per Student** and the **First Child Parishioner Tuition Rate**. **The disparity between these figures is striking for the 2017-18 school year where the deficit is estimated to be \$953 per student.**

When comparing the **Estimated Deficit per Student** to **TK-8 Enrollment** for each period, the data depicts a high correlation between student enrollment, estimated deficit values per student and fundraising needs. These correlational relationships illustrate that **strong enrollment numbers are necessary to mitigate the gaps between student tuition and education costs.**
