The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is hosting a virtual “Preventing Targeted Violence and Terrorism in Your Community” training program on Thursday, August 4. This class is scheduled from 9:30 – 11:30 PT. There is no cost to participate.

Analysis of previous active shooter events by law enforcement professionals have identified similarities between many attacks. This training will focus on common pre-assault behaviors exhibited by attackers, including triggering events that have precipitated some assaults, with the goal of recognizing these actions and preventing an attack.
