Re: Stop the Bleed training at St. John Vianney, Rancho Cordova

Rancho Cordova Rotary Club is offering a "Stop the Bleed" training program on August 20 at St. John Vianney Parish in Rancho Cordova. Bleeding control is a critical part of an active assailant response program since studies have shown that many shooting victims died from blood loss that could have been controlled if bleeding control measures were immediately taken.

The Rotary Club has partnered with U.C. Davis Medical Center trauma surgeon Dr. David Shatz and the Rancho Cordova Police Department to offer a short two-hour class that teaches emergency bleeding control techniques at St. John Vianney Parish (10497 Coloma Road, Rancho Cordova).

Participants will be provided with a combat application tourniquet (C.A.T.) – the same tourniquets used by the U.S. military - upon completing the program.
