How much does it cost?

The Lay Mission Project is a solely donation-funded Ministry of the Western Dominican Province. The Project's average monthly operational cost is roughly \$50/participant, but because you are responsibile for sanctifing the secular world, you have the right to a formation that enables you to do so, regardless of your financial position. Although participants often give generously, financial support is NOT a requirement!

What is the time commitment?

The Lay Mission Project was developed from the ground-up with the average busy layperson in mind. The regular formation spans a three-year period and follows an academic calendar. In general, we recommend that participants allocate 3 hours per week for watching online formation videos, reading, and reflection. Participants will also meet in person with their local disciple circle about twice monthly. In addition to the small-group meetings, all those participating in the diocesan cohort come together twice per academic year: once for a two-day retreat in the late summer/early fall, and another time for a 1-day workshop in the winter.
