This role requires strong Catholic faith, leadership skills, administrative ability, and a passion for ministry. Bilingual ability (English/Spanish) is strongly preferred.

Key Responsibilities

Youth Ministry (Grades 6–12)

- Plan, organize, and lead youth ministry events, retreats, service projects, and activities.
- Provide catechesis and faith formation aligned with Catholic teaching, with direct oversight of Confirmation preparation.
